The RTCC was created in June 2005 under the combined leadership of the Capital Area Council of Governments (CAPCOG) and the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT), Austin District. The Capital Area Metropolitan Planning Organization currently serves as the administrative lead agency and provides primary staff support for the Committee, and the Committee serves as the formal transportation "Issue Area Group" for the Community Action Network. The Committee includes 31 members representing agencies and organizations that are responsible for providing public transportation services and/or health and human services, as well as other individuals interested in the coordination of public transportation and client transportation services in the Capital Area.
